RECRUITMENT, SELECTION, AND APPOINTMENT OF SCHOOL PERSONNEL.

201

The Diocesan Office of Schools will assist local schools in recruiting teachers, but the selection remains the responsibility of each school administration.

Personnel shall be hired without regard to race, ethnicity, gender, or national origin.

Because the distinctive and unique purpose of the Catholic school is to create a Catholic educational community, it would be normative practice to hire teachers of a Catholic faith background. In the event this is not practical or possible, the person hired should be of Christian orientation with an academic grasp of, although not necessarily a personal commitment to, the basic faith of Catholicism.

The employing entity, be it the pastor or the canonical administrator, in collaboration with the Board of Education should formally approve of the hiring of all teaching and support staff upon the recommendation of the principal or school administrator. Official records should be kept of such recommendation and approval action.

WORKERS COMPENSATION SYSTEM

202

Under the Workers' Compensation System, it is the employers' responsibility to complete a First Report of Injury form for an injured worker, and to submit it to their insurance carrier. Some the First Report of Injury cases may qualify as recordable cases under the OSHA law, and may also be eligible for compensation as of the first day of lost time under the Workers' Compensation law.

The 1992 changes to the Workers' Compensation regulations now require that an employer with more than 25 employees must establish a safety committee.

NOTE: Minnesota OSHA requires that an employer with more than 10 employees in the preceding year must maintain and OSHA 200 Log (Log and Summary of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses) in the current year. The log is used to keep track of "recordable cases", that is, those injuries/illnesses that occur in the work environment, and result in greater that first aid treatment, restriction of work, transfer of duties, or a loss of consciousness.

Relief from Liability for Program Manger
